Gunter Demnig

Lecture followed by a discussion.

In his lecture, the artist Gunter Demnig outlines his artistic career from 1968 onwards, including the project [STOLPERSTEINE](#)



Gunter Demnig studied art education and industrial design at the Hochschule für bildende Künste Berlin (HfbK) from 1967 and later free art at the University of Kassel. Gunter Demnig describes himself as a "traces layer". He has been laying stumbling blocks in memory of victims of the National Socialist era since 1996. In particular, the fate of people who were murdered, deported, expelled or driven to suicide under

National Socialism is to be remembered.

The Stolpersteine are considered the largest decentralized memorial in the world.

Close Season Over - Living with Everyday Anti-Semitism



Lecture with subsequent discussion

Juna Grossmann

Juna Grossmann lives and works in Berlin. She will talk about her stirring experiences with anti-Semitic attitudes and encounters. Topics are: Jewish Berlin, social media in museums, visitor services in museums, Jews and Jewish women in Germany, Judaism for "beginners".

Ms. Grossmann studied special education and has been working for memorial sites and museums for many years. As a research assistant, for example, she created the exhibition "Red Army Women Prisoners of War in the Concentration Camp. Soviet Military Physicians in Ravensbrück".

Since 2009, she has managed the exhibition office of a Berlin museum. In addition, she is a consultant for social media appearances for memorials and cultural institutions. Since 2008, Juna Grossmann has been running the blog irgendwiejuedisch.com and volunteering at rentajew.org.

From a citizen's son loyal to the Emperor to an administrative mass murderer

The Gauleiter and Reich Governor Alfred Meyer and the Wannsee Conference

Dr. Heinz-Jürgen Priamus

Alfred Meyer was one of the NSDAP's multifunctional second-tier party leaders. He was simultaneously Gauleiter of the Gau Westfalen-Nord, Reichsstatthalter in Lippe and Schaumburg-Lippe, Oberpräsident of the province of Westphalia and deputy Reichsostminister. As such, he participated in the infamous "Wannsee Conference" of January 1942 and was jointly responsible for the murder of European Jews. And yet Meyer remained a largely unknown figure - among experts, but even more so among the general public.

The lecture aims to trace the biographical contours of this man, whose life path began as a wealthy conservative and Kaiser-loyal burgher's son and ended as a National Socialist administrative mass murderer and criminal against humanity.

Heinz-Jürgen Priamus, Dr. phil, M.A.

Founding director and long-time director of the Institute for Urban History (ISG), Gelsenkirchen; lecturer at the Faculties of History and Social Sciences at the Ruhr University Bochum; numerous publications on the history of the Weimar Republic and National Socialism as well as on the preliminary phase of the founding of the Federal Republic of Germany; works on the history of cities and urbanization.
