Hugo Rosenthal / Josef Jashuvi, the important Jewish reform pedagogue from Lage



A lecture by retired pastor Martin Hankemeier

Hugo Rosenthal was born on 14 December 1887 in Lage/Lippe and died on 6 December 1980 in Haifa/Israel. From September 1933 to March 1939, he ran the Jewish country school in Herrlingen near Ulm in a reform pedagogical manner.

Hugo Rosenthal taught persecuted, frightened and traumatised Jewish pupils that they could be proud of their Jewishness and encouraged them to be brave and not be humiliated by having to flee abroad or go to a concentration camp. One of his pupils was Esther Bejarano from the later girls' orchestra in Auschwitz, who gives a vivid and moving account of her impressive school life in Herrlingen.

After the government closed the school in 1939, Hugo Rosenthal managed to emigrate to Palestina/Israel and ran the 'Ahawah' school there.

The motto of his pedagogy: "Ignite the hidden flame of the image of God in the child! Trust in the human being! Trust in the child! That is the whole teaching of pedagogy."
